Throughout our four years of high school work the Senior Class of 1950 has been decidedly different from the usual high school class.

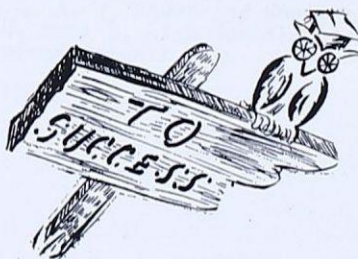
